New England Trade with Mexico & Canada

The New England Council supports the US-Mexico-Canada agreement because trade with these two key partners is vital to the region’s economy.

Key facts:

- New England **exports** to Canada and Mexico totaled nearly **\$13 billion** in 2018.
- Trade with Canada and Mexico supports **over 600,000 jobs** in New England.
- Canada is a **top three** trade partner for all six New England states.
- Mexico is a **top 10** trade partner for five of the six New England states.
