

# Do you provide behavioral health or primary care services in Massachusetts?

You may qualify for **student loan repayment** through the MA Repay program, in amounts up to \$300,000 for behavioral health services, and up to \$100,00 for primary care services.

Applications are open from November 14 - December 12, 2024.



## **BEHAVIORAL HEALTH PROFESSIONALS**

Apply for the MA Repay: MassHealth Behavioral Health Student Loan Repayment Program

#### You are eligible if you...

- ✓ Work in a community-based setting that serves at least 40% MassHealth and/or uninsured patients. Examples of organizations that may be eligible include but are not limited to:
  - Community Health Centers (CHCs)
  - Community Based Organizations
  - Personal Practices
  - Community Hospitals
- ✓ Work in one of the following job roles:
  - Psychiatrist
  - Nurse practitioner with prescribing privileges
  - Licensed or pre-licensed behavioral health clinician
- Provide or supervise direct outpatient behavioral health care
- √ Have a bachelor's degree or higher
- ✓ Have a personal or organizational MassHealth Provider ID and Service Location (PID/SL) or Managed Care Entity (MCE) Provider ID, or are in the process of obtaining either.
- ✓ Have outstanding debt related to your qualifying degree.
- ✓ Are not participating in any other loan repayment programs (participation in Federal Public Service Loan Forgiveness (PSLF) does not disqualify you from MA Repay)

#### **PRIMARY CARE PROVIDERS**

Apply for the MA Repay: MassHealth Primary Care Student Loan Repayment Program

#### You are eligible if you...

- ✓ Work in a community-based setting that serves at least 40% MassHealth and/or uninsured patients. Examples of organizations that may be eligible include but are not limited to:
  - Community Health Centers (CHCs)
  - Community Based Organizations
  - Community Hospitals
- ✓ Work in one of the following job roles:
  - Primary care physician
  - Advanced practice registered nurse, including but not limited to FNP, NP, CPNP-PC, and CNC
  - Physician Assistant with a master's degree from a program accredited by ARC-PA
- ✓ Provide or supervise direct outpatient primary care
- ✓ Have a master's degree or higher
- ✓ Have a personal or organizational MassHealth Provider ID and Service Location (PID/SL) or Managed Care Entity (MCE) Provider ID, or are in the process of obtaining either.
- √ Have outstanding debt related to your qualifying degree
- Are not participating in any other loan repayment programs (participation in Federal Public Service Loan Forgiveness (PSLF) does not disqualify you from MA Repay)

### **SERVICE COMMITMENT**

You must agree to a four-year full-time service commitment in an eligible role at an eligible organization.

- Full-time commitment: Minimum of 35 hours per week for at least 45 weeks per service year
- Full-time service commitment may be satisfied by aggregating employment in two separate eligible settings
